Big book: Paper-making experts Bela Varga and his son Gábor Varga, of the tiny village of Szinpetri in northern Hungary, made what is thought to be the world's largest handmade book. The duo's book measures 4.18 x 3.77 meters (13.7 x 12.4 ft.) and weighs 1,420 kilograms (3,130 lbs.). Its 346 pages are filled with information and photos about the flora and fauna of the region. On display at the Szinpetri paper mill, the book had to be lowered into place with a crane. So as not to rip the paper when reading, six people are needed to turn one of the enormous pages. The name of the book is Our Fragile Natural Heritage.

Magical place: Off the west coast of Scotland lies the Isle of Skye, on which is a magical place called the Fairy Pools. Located near the village of Carbost, the pools contain crystal clear turquoise waters. There are numerous small waterfalls that flow from one pool to another. Surrounding the Fairy Pools is a craggy range known as the Cuillin Mountains. Visitors can swim in the pools, but the water is cold, so a wetsuit is recommended. To get to this natural wonder, it is necessary to hike through the Glen Brittle forest, but visitors say it's worth the effort!



Baked Salmon Fillets Dijon

Ingredients

- 4 (4 ounce) fillets salmon 3 tbsp. - prepared Dijon-style mustard
- salt and pepper to taste 1/4 cup - Italian-style dry bread
- crumbs 1/4 cup - butter, melted

RECIPE PREPARATION

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C)
- 2. Line a shallow baking pan with aluminum foil.
- 3. Place salmon skin-side down on foil. Spread a thin layer of mustard on the top of each fillet, and season with salt and pepper.
- 4. Top with bread crumbs, then drizzle with melted
- 5. Bake in a preheated oven for 15 minutes, or until salmon flakes easily with a fork
