

RECIPE PREPARATION

1. Place ham with rind on rack in roasting pan, fat side up

2. Roast at 300 degrees for 18 minutes per lb.

3. During the last hour trim rind, score fat criss-cross and stud with cloves.

4. Sprinkle top with brown sugar, then 3 tsp Kahlua.

5. Pour $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of Kahlua and mixed mustard into pan

6. Baste frequently with pan syrup continuing to complete baking.




