Wolf dog: Rottweilers may have a reputation for being fierce dogs, but they are not wolves. But some zookeepers in central China hoped that visitors wouldn't be able to tell the difference. He realized at the time that he'd lost the billfold, but then completely forgot about it in later years. Someone found it behind a locker in 2014, and the search for Grisham began. Finally, amateur sleuths located him through social media, emails, and snail mail. Getting the wallet back thrilled the nonagenarian and his family. Inside were relics of his past, including his driver's license and his Navy ID.



Double Chocolate Candy Cane Coffee Cookies



- Ingredients:

 3 Tbsp Door County Candy Cane Coffee

 ½ cup boiling water Steep 10 minutes. Set aside

 ½ cup bottening

 ½ cup butter

 1 ½ cups sugar
 2 eaas

 - 2 eggs
 2 Thsp Reserved strong coffee
 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
 ½ tsp peppermint extract
